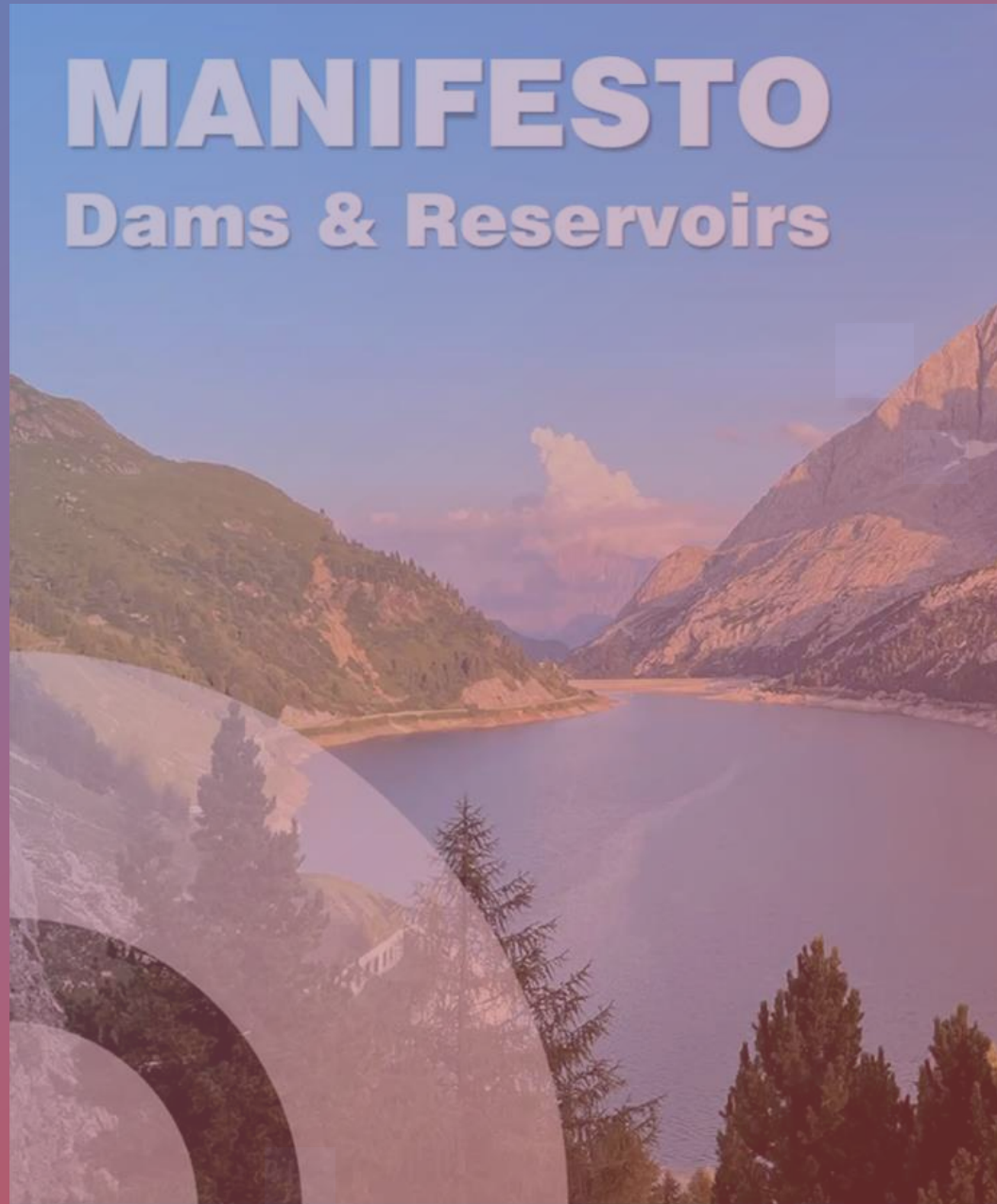




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PREFACE

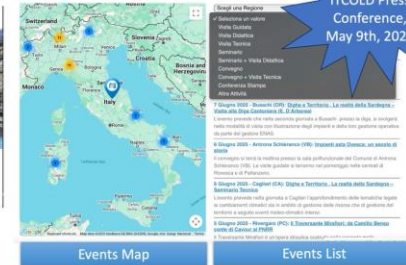

We have plans for a series of webinars, the next one will probably deal with the specifics of levees on monitoring.

Now that the by-laws of EurCOLD have been updated, the WG will update its Terms of Reference and its membership, in order to be consistent with the by-laws. We will also think about a possible deliverable report.

And finally, the ICOLD TC LE, for which the WG acts as a European mirror group, recently submitted to ICOLD its second bulletin, a comprehensive comparison between dams and levees.

EurCOLD Working Group “Penstocks, pressure shafts and pressure tunnels”

To raise awareness of the EurCOLD Working Group’s activities within the global scientific community, several WG members summarized the content of the five ongoing Bulletins in an article published in October 2025 in Geomechanics and Tunnelling:

The article was presented by Wolfgang Richter at the 74th Geomechanics Colloquium, held in October 2025 in Salzburg, Austria, an annual event that brings together experts in rock mechanics, underground construction and hydropower. The article emphasizes the importance of sharing and analysing past failures to strengthen safety culture and promote a multidisciplinary approach in designing new structures.

A review of major international standards highlights their strengths and limitations, reinforcing the need for a unified European safety framework to ensure reliability, resilience and economic feasibility. Special focus is given to innovative inspection technologies such as Remotely Operated Vehicles (ROVs), laser scanners, acoustic sonar, and drones. These tools enable accurate inspections under challenging conditions without dewatering the waterways, improving operator safety and data quality while supporting maintenance planning and risk management.

A busy year for the BDS



Eigiau Dam, Wales, failed in 1925

2025 marked the 100th anniversary of two lethal dam failures in the UK. Those incidents led to implementation of the current UK legislation which has ensured no fatalities from dam failures since that time. Commemorative events were held at the sites in Scotland and Wales, with the British Dam Society (BDS) contributing to permanent memorials.

Behind the scenes, our members are working with Government bodies looking to future changes to legislation, to ensure that our reservoirs continue to remain safe.

This was over and above our normal packed programme of evening programmes, site visits, and our one-day Supervising Engineers' forum, attended by a record 286 delegates. 20 BDS members attended the ICOLD meeting in China, including seven Young Professionals, of which five had been awarded BDS bursaries to travel and attend.

Our programme of monthly lunchtime webinars, primarily for the continuing professional development of our Young Professionals, has proved very popular, and access has now been extended to all members.

Our annual photography competition attracts an increasing number of entrants, with many of the photographs used on the front cover of our technical journal Dams and Reservoirs, or in our Yearbook.

Our paper competition for Young Professionals also attracted a number of quality papers, with many of our members attending an evening event to hear the presentations.

SwedCOLD Activities 2025

SwedCOLD's activities in 2025 were marked by strong technical engagement, international participation and strengthened Nordic cooperation along with valuable networking opportunities.

In April, the 1-day Spring Symposium was held in Stockholm under the theme **“Floods and Discharge Safety.”** The morning session was conducted in English and focused on lessons learnt from dam failures under flood events by keynote speakers Mr Laurent Mouvet from Switzerland and Mr Piotr Śliwiński from Poland. The event, organized in cooperation with the Swedish Committee on Design Flood, attracted more than 150 participants (33% women, 67% men), reflecting the high relevance of flood management and spillway design in a changing climate. The following day, the Committee on Design Floods organized a symposium and workshop dedicated to design floods and new opportunities to measure extreme flows.

The ICOLD Annual Meeting and Congress took place in Chengdu, China, with twenty participants representing Sweden. Prior to the meeting, SwedCOLD, together with the other Nordic countries, submitted proposals aimed at improving transparency and working procedures within ICOLD, including clear voting processes and expanded opportunities for digital participation. The proposals were received positively and referred to the new ad hoc Constitutional Committee for further development and implementation in ICOLD procedures.

In October, SwedCOLD replaced its traditional Autumn Symposium with the 3rd **Nordic Dam Safety Seminar in Falun, Sweden** under the theme **“Dam Monitoring and Surveillance”**, organized in coordination with the Nordic Tailings Network. Close to 130 participants attended from Sweden, Finland, Norway and Iceland (35% women, 65% men). The program featured speakers from across the Nordic region representing consulting firms, hydropower operators, universities, and research institutes. The seminar included technical site visits — hydropower professionals visited the spillway gate replacement project at Forshuvudforsen, while tailings specialists visited the Garpenberg mine. The event also included a joint evening activity at the historic Tuna Hästberg mine – now an “adventure mine” – strengthening professional networks across the Nordic countries.

Two issues of the SwedCOLD newsletters were published during the year, one in Swedish one in English hence the Nordic Seminar.

SwedCOLD’s Young Professionals Forum (approximately 136 members) organized both spring and fall meetings in connection to the Symposia. To introduce the next generation of engineers to the dam industry SwedCOLD covered participation expenses for ten university students attending the ICOLD Annual meeting in Chengdu.

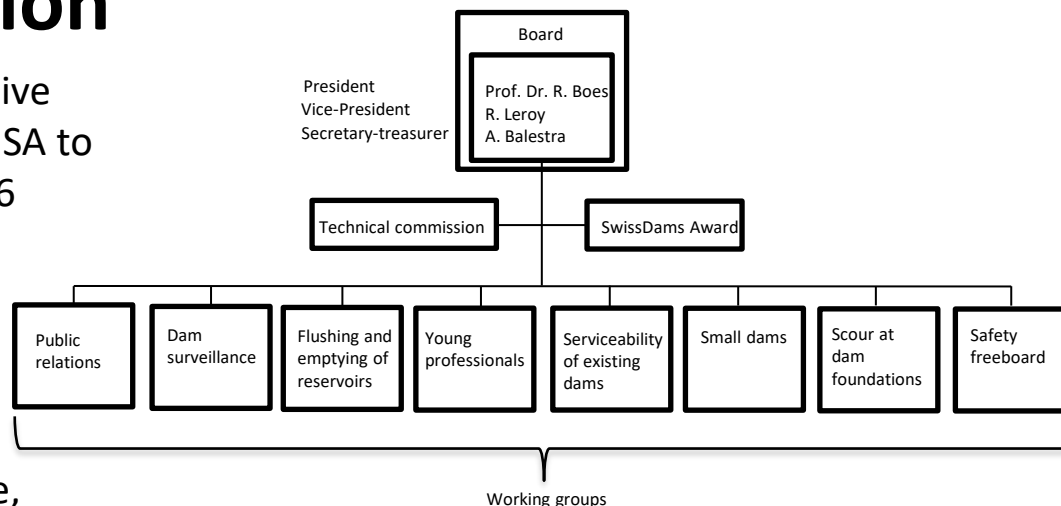

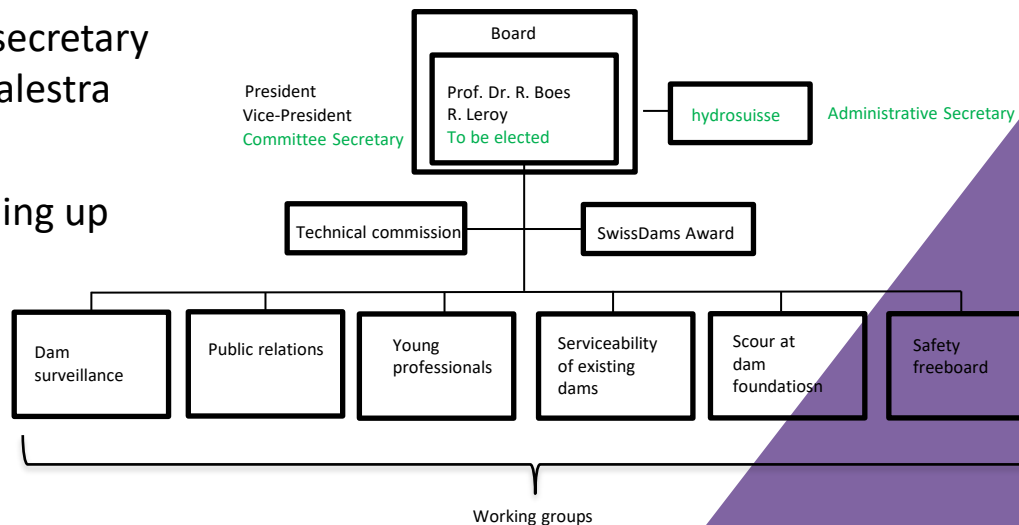

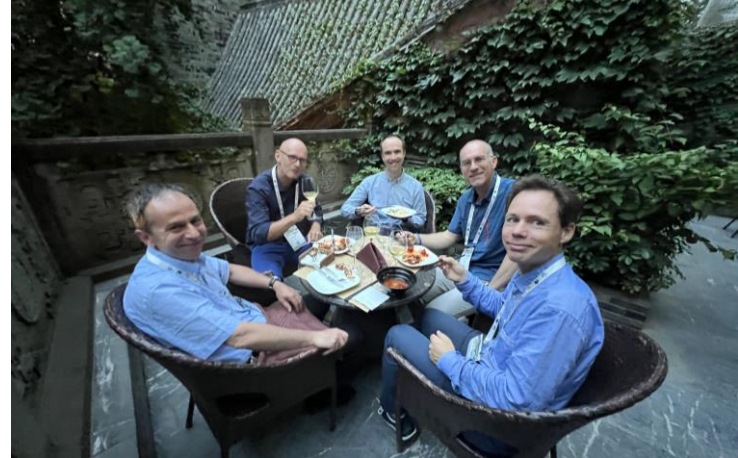


2025 Social Event EurCOLD hosted by Carpi and Hydroplus

Account of Tenure 2023-2025

Account of Tenure 2023 – 2025

During the 2023-2025 term, EurCOLDF significantly strengthened its technical and organizational activities establishing one (1) European Working Group, one (1) Task Force and three (3) Ad Hoc Groups. The formal engagement of Young Professionals was reinforced through their participation in Board Meetings, Working Groups, dedicated symposium sessions, and joint webinar initiatives.

Capacity development remained a core priority. EurCOLDF supported the organization of the 12th and the ongoing 13th European Club Symposia, numerous Working Group activities, including international symposia, workshops, conferences, webinars and delivered two (2) EurCOLDF webinars with ICOLDF Young Professionals support, alongside additional events organized for Dams and Reservoirs Day.

Significant progress was achieved in public awareness and acceptance of dams. The establishment of the “Dams and Reservoirs Day” engaged 19 National Committees, reaching thousands of participants across Europe through coordinated campaigns, declarations, news releases and promotional material. This effort was further reinforced by the approval of the updated Manifesto on Dams and Reservoirs, the creation of a video slideshow, the upgrade of the EurCOLDF website and the launch of an active LinkedIn presence.

A major institutional milestone of this tenure was the drafting, discussion and approval of the EurCOLDF By-Laws and amendments to the 1995 Constitution. These documents formalized long-established practices, strengthened governance, clarified procedures for Board operations and Working Groups, embedded Young Professionals participation and enhanced outreach and coordination across EurCOLDF.

In parallel, EurCOLDF consolidated its organizational strategies through improved communication and promotion tools, the publication of three (3) newsletters, enhanced media management and the organization of six (6) Board Meetings (four in situ and two online), while continuing the efforts to broaden representation of European ICOLDF member countries. Looking forward, EurCOLDF has already laid the groundwork for further activities and initiatives to be carried forward as well as actions related to funding opportunities and the promotion of EurCOLDF positions on the role of Dams and Reservoirs.

These achievements were made possible by the dedication and collaboration of the Board and Secretary, the National Committees, the Working Group Chairs and members, the Young Professionals, the Website and Media Managers and colleagues across Europe.

I would like to express my sincere thanks to all contributors for their continuous support and valuable contributions throughout this term and wish every success to the new President and Board for the 2026-2028 EurCOLDF tenure. As EurCOLDF celebrates 30 years since its establishment in 2025, it is well positioned to build on this strong foundation and further strengthen its role at the European level.

2026-2028 Tenure Opening

Today, more than **35 000 dams** and reservoirs are in operation throughout Europe. **8 200 of them** are classified as large dams serving multiple essential purposes: Hydropower generation, irrigation, water supply, flood protection, fisheries, transport, tourism, urban and recreational development.

These structures are not merely engineering works. They are fundamental components of Europe's resilience. They support the energy transition through renewable hydropower, ensure water security under increasing climate variability, protect communities from extreme flood events and contribute significantly to regional economic development.

At the same time, our sector faces growing challenges: aging infrastructure, stricter safety expectations, environmental and social considerations, climate adaptation requirements and the need for continuous technological innovation.

In this context, the EURCOLD has a crucial mission. The European Club of ICOLD is an integral part of ICOLD. As the European regional platform within ICOLD, we must not only coordinate regional cooperation but also actively contribute to ICOLD's global technical leadership. Our strength lies in unity, collaboration and shared expertise across National Committees, Engineers, Universities, NGOs, Governance bodies and Dam Operators.

During this mandate, our work will focus on 5 key strategic priorities as follows:

- 1- Strengthening and expanding the EWG, Task Force and Ad-Hoc Groups
- 2- Technical Development and Innovation in the Dam sector
- 3- Enhancing Cooperation between European National Committees and experts
- 4- Promoting and Increasing the visibility of the European dam sector
- 5- Supporting, Cooperation and strengthening of the Young Engineers Forum

The 2026-2028 mandate of EURCOLD should be a period of consolidation, modernization and strategic strengthening

Together, as a united European community, we can ensure that dams, reservoirs and levees remain safe, sustainable and indispensable for Europe's future.
